**SUBJECT:** EAST SUSSEX, SOUTH DOWNS AND  
BRIGHTON AND HOVE WASTE AND  
MINERALS SITES PLAN

### **THE DECISION**

**RESOLVED** - That the Committee:

- (1) notes the progress on the content of the Waste and Minerals Sites Plan;
- (2) approves the Consultation Draft document for a nine week period of public consultation commencing on 4<sup>th</sup> July 2014; and
- (3) authorises the Head of Planning and Public Protection to make, if necessary, minor changes to the document arising from any views of the County Council and National Park Authority which do not result in a change of policy direction.

### **REASON FOR THE DECISION**

This is the first Consultation Draft of the East Sussex, South Downs and Brighton & Hove Waste and Minerals Sites Plan (henceforth the 'Sites Plan'). The Sites Plan is being jointly prepared by the City Council, East Sussex County Council and the South Downs National Park Authority. It is a continuation of the excellent joint working arrangements which resulted in the joint Waste & Minerals Plan (WMP) being adopted by the three authorities in early 2013.

The adopted WMP sets out the strategic policy framework for waste and minerals development in the Plan Area, but does not include site specific allocations. The Sites Plan will provide this detail, and together the two documents will form the complete 'Local Plan' for waste and minerals until 2026/27, covering the administrative areas of East Sussex and Brighton & Hove, including part of the South Downs National Park.

### **DETAILS OF ANY ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS**

The City Council has made a commitment with its partners East Sussex County Council and the South Downs National Park Authority to produce the Waste & Minerals Sites Plan.

A clear need for additional waste recycling and recovery capacity is demonstrated in the adopted Waste & Minerals Plan in order to achieve the Plan's targets for diverting waste from landfill. Not proceeding with the Sites Plan would hinder the delivery of this new infrastructure by failing to provide a clear planning policy

framework to developers as to the most suitable locations.
