Dear Sir / Madam

At the end of last year we sent you information and a questionnaire concerning a proposal for a residents parking scheme in your area. The report from this consultation was sent to Environment Cabinet Meeting on 19 February 2009 and a residents parking scheme was agreed to include roads to the west and north of your road.

Residents of Compton Road, Inwood Crescent and Millers Road were against the proposals for a parking scheme. However, other roads around this area were clearly in favour and will be proceeding with a scheme for these (see enclosed plan). We wanted to inform residents in your roads about what is happening in nearby roads and to make you aware of possible displacement issues from roads that want a parking scheme.

Therefore, we are contacting all residents in Compton Road, Inwood Crescent and Millers Road to establish how they would like the council to proceed. It has been agreed that we would write to all residents in these roads giving you the chance to comment on the two options of:

## 1. To extend the Preston Park Station resident parking scheme into your road.

## 2. No to extending the Preston Park Station Parking Scheme into your road.

## Important Information

The extended scheme, if approved, would mean residents only bays and shared Pay & Display bays could be implemented between 9am - 8pm Monday to Sunday. This would deter vehicles from parking all day in these roads. Residents and their visitors would be able to use these spaces by purchasing a £104 annual resident permit or a £2 day visitor permit (these are bought in advance). Outside of these hours, bays would be available to the general public. The scheme would look very much like that suggested in the detailed design leaflet.

We need to be very focused in what we do if we are to deliver a workable solution

for residents in a short timescale. Officers must work to the approved timetable that looks to deliver parking schemes to areas across the city, which have been requesting solutions for some years and have been on the waiting list for a considerable time. Officers are concerned that the displacement of vehicles may occur into your road and residents need to be aware that if you still require no scheme then further detailed consultation and design in your area would not be possible for **several years in the future**.
