#### FOR GENERAL RELEASE

#### 1. SUMMARY AND POLICY CONTEXT:

- 1.1 Local Involvement Networks (LINks) are organisations intended to facilitate public involvement in the planning and performance monitoring of local health and social care services.
- 1.2 A Brighton & Hove LINk was established in April 2008 when a Host organisation was appointed by the city council to manage the LINk. This report provides an update on the progress of the LINk in the last six months, both from the perspective of the council's LINk Contract Manager (see appendix 1) and from the LINk Host (see appendix 2)

#### 3. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

3.1 Local Involvement Networks (LINks) are organisations intended to facilitate public and stakeholder involvement in the commissioning and

- delivery of local health and social care services. LINks were established by the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act (2007).
- 3.2 LINks are envisaged as networks, bringing together individuals and organisations with particular interests in aspects of health and social care.
- 3.3 LINks can comment on health and social care initiatives, input to the commissioning process, monitor the delivery of services and gauge the views of the broader community on all of these issues.
- 3.4 The Government anticipates that LINks will work closely with local authority Overview & Scrutiny Committees and has provided LINks with a statutory power to refer items to Overview & Scrutiny.
- 3.5 Local Authorities were given the task of procuring Host organisations for their local LINk and for managing the contract with the preferred LINk Host. After a procurement process, the Brighton & Hove Community & Voluntary Sector Forum was awarded the contract to host the Brighton & Hove LINk. Appendix 1 to this report contains additional information relating to the council's contract with the LINk Host.
- LINk Host organisations are required to attract and enrol LINk members, advise the LINk membership, provide administrative support and ensure that the LINk delivers according to its contractual obligations. Appendix 2 to this report contains additional information on how the LINk Host has sought to establish the Brighton & Hove LINk.
