3. (i) To receive the following Petition presented at the meeting of Council held on 25 October 2012 on behalf of the West Pier Traders Association and containing 7840 signatures.

"The development of the i-360 tower on the site of the West Pier means that the West Pier Market, which has run on the site since 1996, will no longer be able to operate in its current location. We, the undersigned, call on the council to find a solution for the traders to continue to trade on Brighton seafront whilst the construction of the i-360 is underway and

to find a permanent solution to siting the market as part of the area once building of the i-360 has been completed.”
