3. (iii) Stanmer Park Road Parking– Emma Rompani

3. (iii) Let’s maintain free parking for Hollingdean residents– Gordon Kay

“This petition is to counter another petition supporting the idea of resident parking proposed to be delivered to the Environment, Transport and Sustainability Committee council meeting on 19 March. We believe this will not solve the problem of parking but means that most will pay £130-163 to gain a permit, but still have difficulty parking as the bigger parking issues are after 8pm when the scheme would not function”
